



Message from the Chair

A big Thank You to all our supporters: GDC members, Executives, GDC Fellows, non-members and partners! Our 9th annual "Get Behind Design" campaign, plus scholarship donations, raised \$5,655.

In 2019, there were 53 donations from 42 donors, with gifts ranging from \$10 to \$1,500, with an average of \$150.

There were 11 GDC Fellows who contributed to the Fellows' Challenge, for a total of \$2,060.

The Foundation fund total, which includes our targeted scholarship funds, finished 2019 at \$83,393.

General fund donations (Foundation total less scholarship funds) stand at \$51,028.79.

We have two conservative, long term investments: the Ray Hrynkow Scholarship mutual fund, which at 2019 year-end had a market value of \$17,384, and the General fund mutual fund, market value \$49,485. We expect these to fluctuate with the downturn of the economy in 2020.

We are still working toward a self-sustaining fund so that we can distribute the interest annually. Our funds are growing through annual donations from designers and supporters, building a Foundation that is already helping students and will help designers, and the profession.

Special Thanks

The Vancouver Island Chapter donated \$550 to the Cheryl Lynn Rutledge Northern Indigenous Student Award, fulfilling a pledge from 2018, and later added proceeds from their Indigenous Design event.

And thank you to our two anonymous donors who contributed \$1,705.

Scholarships

In 2019 we awarded two scholarships of \$1,000 and one of \$500. This makes a total of \$8,500 given out in scholarships since the Foundation program started in 2012. Each scholarship is supported annually by the donor, and member donations help build a fund to help with the longevity of the scholarships.

Thank you to Casey Hrynkow FGDC for her ongoing funding of the Ray Hrynkow Scholarship Fund.
Thank you also to Mark Rutledge CGD for initiating the Cheryl Lynn Rutledge Northern Indigenous Student Award, and to Ryan P. Singer for the UX Design Scholarship.


Judges' comments:

Ryan Senger hopes the award he has established encourages emerging designers to create for a better tomorrow through understanding, consideration, and empathy.









The GDC Foundation Ray Hrynkow Scholarship

The Scholarship was created in honour of Ray Hrynkow, a respected Vancouver, BC design professional, teacher and GDC Fellow who passed away in 2012. The GDC Foundation has two mutual fund investment accounts with the TD Bank: one for the Ray Hrynkow Scholarship fund and one for the General Fund. Both earned over 6% interest since 2016. Statements are available upon request.

Scholarship donors contribute 10% on top of the award amount to the operations fund to support administration.
